



**Licensed drivers convicted of touting:
Revocation of licences**

The Mayor of London recently announced plans to introduce a 'one strike and you're out' policy for licensed drivers convicted of touting.

This means that any licensed driver convicted of touting **on or after 1 August 2008** will have his or her driver's licence revoked.

Drivers who have their licences revoked under these circumstances may not be considered for a fresh licence before the expiry of 12 months from the date of revocation.

This policy does not affect a licensee's statutory rights of appeal against the decision of the Licensing Authority.
