Briefing Note: 'Cash for Crash'



Instances of 'Cash for Crash' Insurance Fraud against London Buses

At the Audit and Assurance Committee meeting held on 17 December 2014, a question was raised about whether there had been instances of 'cash for crash' insurance frauds perpetrated against buses in London.

The following are recent and current cases relating to insurance fraud investigated by our MPS partners in the Roads Transport Policing Command (RTPC).

Defendant Patricia Walker: A London bus collided with her parked unattended car, and she was seen on bus CCTV to be on the opposite side of the road at the time of the collision. However, she subsequently submitted a claim for personal injury. She was found guilty at Snaresbrook Crown Court, sentenced to a Community Order, Curfew Requirement of 3 months, and Costs of £500. The fraud saving is circa £30k.

Defendant Sammy Adefaroti: He drove his vehicle in front of an Abellio London bus and then deliberately slammed on the brakes in front of it, causing a collision. He was convicted at Woolwich Crown Court, for dangerous driving and fraud. The fraud saving is circa £20k.

An Abellio bus collided with a stationary unattended VW Sharan. Bus CCTV shows that the vehicle was empty at the time of the collision, but four defendants submitted claims for personal injury. They were convicted and sentenced as follows:

- Kumar Balan 9 months imprisonment, suspended for 2 years, 200 hours unpaid work, £200 costs.
- Kala Balan 12 months imprisonment, suspended for 2 years, 300 hours unpaid work, £200 costs.
- Rajendiren Rajasuresh 9 months imprisonment, suspended for 2 years, 200 hours unpaid work, £200 costs.
- Jeyakumah Resiah 9 months imprisonment, suspended for 2 years, 200 hours unpaid work, £200 costs.

The fraud saving is circa £30k.

There are also currently two live cases in process involving Metroline buses.

The bus companies are aware that there is an issue, and the RTPC have delivered a number of awareness presentations to interested groups.
